LOWER ELEMENTARY

UPPER ELEMENTARY

Upper Elementary has started our second semester with an exciting unit on **Mexico**. Students have studied the fascinating **History** of the country from the Maya and the Aztec, to the Mexican Revolution, through to present day. We have also discussed the diverse **Geography and Climate of Mexico**, **Flag and Political Map**, and will be rounding out the unit with **Mexican Art**, **Music**, and of course, **Food**! Our unit study has included the reading of

<u>Coco: A Story About Music, Shoes, and Family</u> which has been a huge hit with the class! We look forward to debuting a new geography unit after Rodeo Break!

In Language, Upper El. has embarked on our study of

poetry! This unit features lessons on figurative language, including **Metaphors**, **Similes**, **and Idioms**. We will also be exploring the **Structure of Poetry**, **Types of Poems**, and **How to Analyze a Poem**. We look forward to the beautiful and creative poems that our students will write as a part of this unit! Furthermore, UE students will once again submit poems to the Sonoran Desert Museum Poetry contest.

Geometry has been the topic of the month for Upper El. 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. Students have been diving into topics like **Perimeter**, **Area**, **Angles**, and **Volume**, to name a few.

The semester **Science** lessons began with a journey of the Earth. Lessons included **Types of Rocks**, **Weathering and Erosion**, **The Rock Cycle**, **Plate Tectonics**, and **Volcanoes**! We are currently in the thick of our **Energy Unit**. The students have learned about **Types of Energy** and **Energy Transformations** by making delicious toast—ask your student all about it! At present, we are learning about **Power Plants**, **Renewable vs. Non-Renewable Resources**,

Upper El students learning about dams and hydroelectric power. These students have created a buttress dam with clay and sticks.

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as well as **Alternative & Sustainable Resources**. The **Energy Unit** will conclude with a thorough look at **Electricity**, **Magnets**, and **Electrical Circuits**.

Yearbook design is underway! The class is very excited to create this year's yearbook. Our art teacher, Paige, has done an amazing job guiding this year's art lessons with elements of **Design**, **Shape**, and **Color** with many mediums!

In **Choir**, The Montessori Treble-Makers have begun writing an **Opera** based on Shakespeare's **A Midsummer Night's Dream**. So far, the students have completed many scenes and song lyrics. We will begin composing the music this week. Stay tuned; it's going to be an awesome production! The date of the concert is TBD.

Also, thank you for a successful **Winter Concert** in January. The children sang marvelously, and we had nearly-perfect attendance! Congrats to all singers!
