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2nd graders are wise and accomplished role models. We are exploring the **Formation of the Earth**, its layers, **Types of Rocks** and the parts of **Volcanoes**. Soon we will segue into discovering **Lucy**, our ancient Australopithecus, who will lead us to our study of **Early Humans** and the **Ice Age**.

Math is always wildly popular and the students love reading **Big Numbers**, adding & subtracting and decoding which numbers are **Odd** & which are **Even**.

Everyone is practicing their **Reading** proficiency via Phonics books and chapter books and learning **Parts of Speech**: Noun, Verb & Adjective.

As we begin our fall study of **US History** we will go into depth with the **Pioneers** as they travel West in covered wagons. Get ready for oil cloth and hard tack....

UPPER ELEMENTARY

The **Upper Elementary** class has started the year with enthusiasm and a contagious love of learning! Our **Language** studies have begun with an investigation of **Narratives**, including the **Elements of a Story**, the **Components of a Plot**, and 1st and 3rd Person Points of View. Grammar studies have focused on **Complete Sentences**, **Punctuation**, and **Parts of Speech**. Students have been applying their language skills to weekly writing prompts, ranging from accounts of fond birthday memories to fictional stories about enchanted forests!

In Math, students began the year with Place Value, Expanded Notation, and Rounding. They have since delved into the exciting world of Multiplication and Division using Arrays and Area Models. Ask your student to demonstrate how these work—you'll be amazed!

We have also begun our fall semester **Geography** unit, an overview of **Native Americans of North America**. Students have been working with a beautiful basket of objects containing 17 different elements of Native American life, and next will be learning about regional tribes of the United States.

Science began with a lesson on the Beginning of the Universe, and from there has branched out to include The Expanding Universe, The Life Cycle of an Average Star, and Galaxies. We so look forward to sharing our knowledge on the Universe and Astronomy at our Star Gazing Night on September 30, 6-7:30pm!

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In **Choir**, students have mastered singing rounds in different parts. They are taking rhythm dictation and have started work on **Solfege**, the "Do-Re-Mi's" of singing.

Art is also off to a great start with unit themed lessons such as **Cuneiform Clay Tablets**, and **Cave "Paintings,"** to fundamental art concepts that include exploration of line, shape, and color.

CONSTRUCTION OF NEW CLASSROOM

We must thank you all again for your cooperation and patience with various inconveniences during our construction phase. We appear to be in the home stretch and, hopefully, after our extra-long **Columbus Day holiday** (October 10th and 11th) will be almost done.

Then we can enjoy more classroom space, more Parent Conference space and even choir and music space, among other things. **CAN'T WAIT!**
