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will also be highlighting study of the **African Elephant** as a treasured and endangered species.

Olive's **Math** has exploded further into number comprehension with the **Rounding Hill** (if you can't get all the way up, you round down; 5 or more, you're over the hill!) and the gorgeous Montessori **Long Chains**, the chains of the numbers **cubed**! Students have also been fully exploring **multiplication** with sets and beads.

We have only just begun our **Poetry** sequence with **Elements of a Poem** and look forward to lots more coming. In **Parts of Speech**, the **Preposition** currently reigns.

We have more **Biomes** to explore with **Rainforest** & **Ocean** coming soon...

Hope your projects are coming to fruition! **All projects are due Monday, December 3**rd. Can't wait!

UPPER ELEMENTARY

In Science, the students have been studying the Scientific Method. They are applying the Scientific Method by conducting controlled experiments with lima bean plants. More recently, we have begun a Chemistry Unit, learning about The Bohr Model, The periodic Table of Elements, and Classification of Matter. Ask your student about spelling your name using chemical symbols from the Periodic Table!

In **Math**, all students are working with fractions. Our unique materials allow the students to manipulate fractions and solve complex problems. Our lessons run the gamut from adding and subtracting simple fractions to multiplying **Mixed Numbers**. In the coming weeks, 4ths and 5ths will be moving in to **Decimal Fractions**.

In **Choir**, the students are learning a variety of animal-themed songs. **Our** concert is slated for January 25th. Details and T-Shirt orders are coming!

All Upper El Fall Projects are due on Dec. 3. Students will present their projects in class. Additionally, students with Science Experiments will have the opportunity to participate in the School Science Fair on Saturday, January 12, 2019.

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In **Geography** the students have been learning about the founding of the **United States** and the **Presidents**. In addition, they are digging into the object basket for **Colonial Times** and are learning about tools and objects important to the survival and daily lives of the people during this time. They are especially intrigued about the making of the first American flag, and the tools used to write letters, an inkwell and quill pen.

In **Language** the students have been having fun exploring **Prepositions** and learning about the importance of **Transition Words** in our writing. After weeks of preparation, the students also wrote their own compare and contrast essays based on mythical stories or their two favorite board games. They were especially enjoying the myths of Aneas and Osiris, in addition to the games of Chess and Monopoly.
