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In Geometry, we examined and built Point, Line, Plane, Solid, types of Angles and Polygons....

Our Language and Reading studies have included Elements of a Story (Main Character, Villain, Plot, etc.) and Sentence Building: Noun, Verb, and complete and incomplete sentences, as well as lots and lots of reading practice....

I have attached 2 poems from last spring's collection that never got published. Ryer is now a 3rd grader in Upper Elementary. Margie is now a 2nd grader in Lower Elementary, written as 2nd and 1st graders, respectively. Enjoy.

UPPER ELEMENTARY

The school year is off to a terrific start! The Upper Elementary classrooms are chock-full of creative work by the students! They are enjoying making beautiful poster recordings of our **Geography** unit, which has included **Types of Maps**, **Cartography**, **State Capitals**, and **State Landmarks**. More recently, they have been working with our **Arizona** unit, discovering the **Biomes of Arizona**, **State Symbols**, and **Arizona History**.

They are also enjoying making elaborate and artful poster recordings in **Science**. We have been looking closely at natural selection and evolution with jobs such as **Darwin & Natural Selection**, **Amazing Evolution**, **Evolution of Whales**, **Evolution of Humans**, and **Adaptations**.

Math is in full swing for all grade levels. Third grade students are learning **Division** after studying **Multiplication** with arrays. Fourth and fifth grade students are feverishly working with **Order of Operations** and are creating their own equations.

Music, **Art**, **Spanish**, and **Chess** are off to a fantastic start. In **Choir** we are learning wonderful music, some of it SPOOKY! Art classes have had very creative projects, such as T-Shirt bags, comic strips, origami. In addition, students have sketch books that they work in on a weekly basis. Ukulele classes are held on Fridays on a grade-level rotation. They are learning how to read chords and how to strum.

Our Language Arts presentations have focused on Sentence Analysis, Paragraph Writing, Parts of Speech. We are currently delving into a full unit of Informative Writing. The students have already written mini informative essays, and we will be expanding this skill into larger essays, for which they will do their own research. This is in preparation of their Fall Project (notices coming soon).
